# IDENTIFY COMMON QUESTIONS IN PRACTICE

Like evidence, there are some questions with higher value for each clinician,

#### FIND THE EVIDENCE

Information literacy is a skill set but modern resources make it easy.

### EVALUATE THE EVIDENCE

Evaluate studies by using your clinical knowledge to evaluate methodology.

## Finding evidence 2 TYPES OF QUESTIONS

- Everyday questions directly related to practice
- Less common questions less directly related to practice

The everyday questions should incorporate a more rigorous investigation into primary literature and the secondary less common questions can be addressed by secondary literature.



## Talking points



- Tools that we can use like CEVM's VetSRev and Best Bets for Vets.
- Not all questions are equal. Prioritize
- We are not statisticians, look to the methodology we can evaluate to determine quality. That being said, certain tests should be commonly seen.
